Did You Know?

What is the status of the Sports Park located at 3900 West & 4200 South? This park has been under construction for many years as we have slowly gotten funding for each piece. Much of the park has been built with RAMP money. Recently, the City Council has approved completion of the park, including sprinklers, grass, and the remaining parking lot.

Once the new lawn is fully established, we will have three soccer fields on the west side of the park - two U10 and one U12.

The original design of the park included volleyball courts directly to the west of the basketball courts. Though the volleyball courts are still an option for the future, they have been put on hold due to inactivity on the existing volleyball courts in our city. They are something that can be added in the future.

There is also room between the baseball fields for an announcer's stand to be built sometime in the future. There is a possibility of using the school playground to build yet a third diamond, which would affect the design and position of that building. We will wait until that is established before moving forward.

The original design also included a recreation building on the northeast corner. The building is still a future option, but this section is currently being planted in grass for two reasons:

- 1) A recreation building would require a city property tax and/or bonding. Neither of these is in place, so we have opted to plant grass that can be used by residents now.
- 2) There is a possibility of having a community building built for the City in conjunction with the Green Farm subdivision. Until that is completed, we will not know exactly what is needed in an additional public recreation building. (As a side note, there is still property near City Hall for a possible future senior-type center. That need may also be met with the Green Farm building.)

CERT

Basic CERT Training September 14 - October 26

The CERT training class will be held once a week 6:30 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. in Ogden. There is a \$30 participation fee for all new CERT participants. The fee covers the government required personal safety gear which is issued to each participant at the beginning of the class. West Haven City will reimburse all city residents that complete the CERT training.

What is CERT?

CERT stands for "**Community Emergency Response Team**". CERT is a group of individuals who have taken the CERT training and have the basic skills needed to be better prepared in the case of an emergency. CERT training covers many topics including: Personal Disaster Preparedness, Fire Safety - Fire Extinguishers, Disaster Medical Operations (Triage, Medical Assessment, Treatment, Packaging and Transport) Light Urban Search and Rescue, Team Organization, Disaster Psychology, Terrorism Awareness, and Hazmat Awareness. The training takes about 20 hours to complete.

Storm Water Info

Home Repair and Improvement

- Before beginning an outdoor project , locate the nearest storm drain and protect them from debris and other materials.
- Sweep up and properly dispose of construction debris such as concrete and mortar.
- Use hazardous substances like paints, solvents, and cleaners in the smallest amounts possible and follow the directions on the label. Clean up spills immediately, and dispose of the waste safely. Store substances properly to avoid leaks and spills.
- Purchase and use nontoxic, biodegradable, recycled, and recyclable products whenever possible.
- Clean paint brushes in a sink, not outdoors. Filter and reused paint thinner when using oil-based paints.

- Properly dispose of excess paints through a household hazardous waste collection program, or donate unused paint to local organizations.
- Reduce the amount of paved area and increase the amount of vegetated area in your yard. Use native plants in your landscaping to reduce the need for watering during the dry periods. Consider directing downspouts away from paved surfaces onto lawns and other measures to increase infiltration and reduce polluted runoff.
- When landscaping keep gutters and driveways swept clean.
