## Mayoral Message

### UDOT

I'm meeting with UDOT in a few days as they want to share the latest with me regarding Legacy highway. I'll keep you posted as I get reliable information. I've heard some rumors from some fairly good sources, but I will wait until the face-to-face to confirm or announce anything.

### Cemetery Update

City employees have been doing a lot of grading at the cemetery and things look vastly different. Next up will be getting the secondary water line installed, final grading, sprinkler plans, and road construction. This must all be done before we can begin to assign sold plots. The committee and then the city council will review the idea of selling plots before complete development with buyers being able to choose their plot according to the purchased order. I will announce decisions as they are made by the committee and presented and validated by the council.

### Pathways

With the level of the river, we can now proceed with the pathways and bridges funded by RAMP through our city and along the river. Two bridges are being built, one to access Marriott-Slaterville from our bowery's and the other to go from the south side of the river to the north side until you get to 1900 West. The second bridge here mentioned will be just west of I-15. We are staking the trail and

preparing bids with the hope that the project can still get done this fall despite the heavy spring and summer flooding. We are dealing with wetland issues as well.

### Animal Control Services

The City currently contracts with the county for Animal Control Services. When a resident calls to report a dog, cat, chicken or any other animal the city is charged \$85.00. Some of the calls being placed to Animal Services are unnecessary, therefore the cost for these calls are becoming prohibitive.

I am strongly considering dropping this arrangement with the county and this service would no longer be available.

### Recreation Program

Football is underway with more participants than ever. Brock and his team do a very good job of managing the program and our teams were 7-1 at home the first week of play. Girl's basketball isn't far away.

### Where did Summer go?

Soon, another seasonal change will be upon us as school is back in session. Please be extra careful around bus stops and walkways to school. Allow yourself plenty of time so you can be very watchful as kids are making their way to school.

## CERT

### Basic CERT Training September 15 - October 27

The class will be held once a week from 6:30 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. in Ogden. To register, or for more information, contact Tammy at 778-6686 or [folkman@co.weber.ut.us](mailto:folkman@co.weber.ut.us).

There is a \$30 participation fee for all new CERT participants. The fee covers the government required personal safety gear which is issued to each participant at the beginning of the class. West Haven City will reimburse the first 25 residents to complete the CERT training this fiscal year.

### What is CERT?

CERT stands for "**Community Emergency Response Team**". CERT is a group of individuals who have taken the CERT training and have the basic skills needed to be better prepared in the case of an emergency. CERT training covers many topics including: Personal Disaster Preparedness, Fire Safety - Fire Extinguishers, Disaster Medical Operations (Triage, Medical Assessment, Treatment, Packaging and Transport) Light Urban Search and Rescue, Team Organization, Disaster Psychology, Terrorism Awareness, and Hazmat Awareness. The training takes about 20 hours to complete.
