Great Utah Shake Out Earthquake Drill

The Great Utah Shake Out is an annual earthquake drill sponsored by Be Ready Utah and the Federal Emergency Management Agency.

This year, the drill will be **April 17 at 10:15 am.**

All individuals are encouraged to:

DROP to the ground (before the earthquake drops you!),
Take **COVER** by getting under a sturdy desk or table, and
HOLD ON to it until the “shaking” stops (about 60 seconds)

All individuals are encouraged to:

- Do a “hazard hunt” for potential items that might fall in your home or business during an earthquake and secure them
- Create a disaster preparedness plan
- Practice how to communicate with family, friends, and co-workers in the event phones are out of service.
- Organize or refresh your emergency supply kits
- Identify your building’s weaknesses and make efforts to fix them
- Enroll in a Community Emergency Response Team (CERT)

Pesticides, Herbicides & Fertilizers

Nationally, one quarter of the pollutants found in rivers and streams originate from the residential use of pesticides, herbicides, and fertilizers. These materials can enter into our waterways through illegal dumping, run-off from excessive lawn irrigation, and from heavy rains. The following guidelines if followed can greatly reduce the potential of these pollutants from entering our waterways.

- *Use pesticide/herbicide/fertilizer only if there is an actual pest problem (not on a regular preventative schedule).*
- *Do not use pesticide/herbicide/fertilizer if rain is expected. Apply only when wind speeds are low (less than 5 mph).*
- *Do not mix or prepare pesticide/herbicide/fertilizer for application near storm drains.*
- *Prepare the minimum amount of pesticide/herbicide/fertilizer needed for the job and use the lowest rate that will effectively control the issues.*
- *Employ techniques to minimize off-target application (e.g. spray drift) of pesticide/herbicide/fertilizer, including consideration of alternative application techniques.*
- *Calibrate pesticide/herbicide/fertilizer application equipment to avoid excessive application.*
- *Sweep pavement and sidewalk if pesticide/herbicide/fertilizer is spilled or overspread on these surfaces.*
- *Purchase only the amount of pesticide/herbicide/fertilizer that you can reasonably use in a given time period (month or year depending on the product).*
- *Triple rinse containers, and use rinse water as product. Dispose of unused pesticide/herbicide/fertilizer as hazardous waste.*
- *Dispose of empty pesticide/herbicide/fertilizer containers according to the instructions on the container label.*

The Top of Utah Transportation Expo will be held Thurs., May 1 at the Weber State University Davis Campus (2750 University Parkway Blvd., Layton), with an opening speaker session from 2:30 p.m. to 4 p.m. and a general expo session from 4 p.m. to 7 p.m. Sponsored by the Utah Department of Transportation, Wasatch Front Regional Council and Utah Transit Authority, this event will feature keynote addresses from Envision Utah Director Robert Grow, Natalie Gochnour with the University of Utah, and Douglas Larsen with the Weber Economic Development Partnership. The Expo will include displays and information from major transportation projects and initiatives underway in Davis and Weber counties including the West Davis Corridor, South Davis I-15 Improvements and Ogden and South Davis transit studies. There will also be participation from local cities, Davis and Weber counties, Weber Pathways, Davis and Ogden-Weber chambers of commerce and various statewide transportation programs such as Zero Fatalities, Road Respect and Travelwise.
